



Offshore Operations Engineer in Training

The Offshore Operations Engineer in Training is responsible for providing the day to day support of platform/facility operations within the framework of Talos Energy LLC's policies and procedures and in compliance of applicable regulations.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

This position will be responsible for day to day offshore operations at Talos Energy including but not limited to:

- Coordinates and completes documentation and activities necessary to provide production.
- Ensures production equipment is maintained according to company standards, enlists mechanical support for regular preventative maintenance.
- Assists teams with developing solutions to rectify issues that may hinder production activities.
- Position works with interdisciplinary offshore teams to develop solutions to ensure efficient and effective operations.
- Ensure platform operations are completed according to proper personal and environmental safety standards
- Day-to-day monitoring of production and well related activities for assigned platform
- Support HSE initiatives and ensure compliance with the agreed HSE procedures/policies and Management Standards
- Identify production enhancement and de-bottlenecking opportunities
- Work with other Operator to develop and maintain an understanding of issues that could hinder delivery of the production forecast to enable early identification of problems and associated mitigations
- During 7 days of office duty, assume the role of Production Technician assisting Production Engineers with day to day activities including organizing field data, generating wellbore schematics, assist with nodal analysis and assist with well work planning.

- 1-3 years experience in upstream oil and gas environment
- Bachelor's degree in petroleum engineering, mechanical engineering or related field

- Exposure to production monitoring and operations a plus

- Have a strong sense of integrity and the ability to deal with ethical situations effectively
- Willing to work a demanding and flexible schedule

- Ability to move freely on multi-level offshore facilities, including climbing multiple stairs to access decks
- Ability to lift up to 50 lbs.
